Act 18th March, 1818. }

On the 20th day of June in the year of our Lord 1818
I, John Sharpe, Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Washington in the State of New York, do swear that I am the subscriber one of the judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Washington in the State of New York, and that I personally appeared before the court of common pleas for the County of Washington in the State of New York, personally appeared Richard Donegan, aged 75 years, residing in the Township of Trumbull, County of New Haven, who being by me first duly sworn, the law directs, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress Entituled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war, that he the said Richard Donegan enlisted into the service of the United States some time in the month of November A.D. 1779 in the Town of Saybrook in the State of Connecticut, for the term of three years, that he served in a company commanded by Captain Converse, in the Second Connecticut Regiment, commanded by Col. Swift, - that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States during the term for which he enlisted & was discharged at West Point in the State of New York, as by his discharge will appear - that he was not in any battle, none having been fought where he served, that he is reduced circumstances & needs the assistance of his County for his support - & that he has no other evidence now in possession (since his discharge) of his said services.

of Talcott in said county who being first duly sworn according to law
doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as
follows. In the Connecticut Line Col. Swift's Regiment Captain Brown
is Company the date of his original declaration was the 20th day of Jan 1776
the number of his pension certificate 11,000. And I do solemnly
swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth
day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in
any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby
to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress
entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land
& naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on
the 18th day of February 1818. - and that I have not nor was any person in
trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me, nor
have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto
assured and by me subscribed.

Madam:

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 43510 it appears that Richard Done or Doan enlisted at Saybrook, Connecticut in November 1779 and served as a private in Captain Converse's Company, Colonel Swift's Connecticut Regiment, and was discharged October 28, 1783.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 30, 1818, while a resident of Fearing Township, Washington County, Ohio, aged fifty-two years.

In 1830, he referred to his wife, Anna, aged forty-four years, and to the following children-

Lyman, aged eighteen years; Asael, aged sixteen years; Anne, aged fifteen years; Philo, aged thirteen

years; Joshua, aged eleven years; Elinda, aged eight years; Diana, aged six years; Richard, aged two years; and William, aged four months.

Soldier died in Washington County, Ohio, about 1836.

There is no further data on file as to family.

The Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to any William Doane, under any spelling of that name.
