in the Township of Tearing, County of State aforesaid, who being by me just

Duly Sworn as the Law Directs, doth on his oath make the following Declaration

in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress Entitled an

act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land & Naval Service of the

United States in the Revolutionary way, that he the said Richard Dorn, was

listed into the Service of the United States some time in the month of Novem-

ber 1779 in the Town of Saybrook in the State of Connecticut, - That he

served ⁱⁿ a Company Commanded by Captain Converse, in the Second Con-

necticut Regiment Commanded by Col. Swift, - that he continued

to serve in the said Corps, or in the Service of the United States during

the Term for which he enlisted & was Discharged at West Point, in

the State of New York, as by his Discharge will appear - that he was

not in any Battles, none having been fought where he served,

that he is reduced Circumstances & Needs the assistance of his Country

for his Support - & that he has no other Evidence now in power

(since his Discharge) of his said Services

The State of Ohio Washington County,

On this fourteenth day of November, 1830 personally appeared in open court being a court of record for the said County Richard Dean aged fifty four years resident in the township of Spring in said county who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows. In the Connecticut line Col. Swifts Regiment. Captain Brown's Company the date of his original declaration was the 20th day of June 1776 the number of his pension certificate 11,611. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March 1813 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th day of March 1813. and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

Madam:

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 43510 it appears that Richard Done or Doan enlisted at Saybrook, Connecticut in November 1779 and served as a private in Captain Converse's Company, Colonel Swift's Connecticut Regiment, and was discharged October 28, 1783.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 20, 1818, while a resident of Fearing Township, Washington County, Ohio, aged fifty-two years.

In 1830, he referred to his wife, Anna, aged forty-four years, and to the following children-

Lyman, aged eighteen years; Asael, aged sixteen years; Anne, aged fifteen years; Philo, aged thirteen

years; Joshua, aged eleven years; Elinda, aged eight years; Diana, aged six years; Richard, aged two years; and William, aged four months.

Soldier died in Washington County, Ohio, about 1836.

There is no further data on file as to family.

The Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to any William Doane, under any spelling of that name.
